Subject: Safety Recall RVXX2101, DRL OVERRIDE

Description of Defect:

On certain vehicles, the Daytime Running Light (DRL) manual override switch programming was set to automatically reactivate at a speed of 24 kilometers per hour (kph). As a result, the vehicles in question do not comply with section 30(c) of Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 108. Under certain conditions this may result in a delayed re-activation of the DRLs that exceeds the distance requirement, which may increase the risk of a vehicle crash.

Models/ Model Years Affected:

Certain 2018 – 2021 VHD, VNL, and VNR manufactured from August 29, 2017 to October 15, 2020.

Vehicle Quantities:

283 all Canada

Dealer's Responsibility:

The National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act and Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Act requires dealers to ensure that all new and used vehicles are free of safety defects and comply with all relevant safety standards at the time of delivery to the consumer.

Dealers should make their personnel aware of the safety recall. In the event that a dealer has a vehicle included in the safety recall in their inventory to be sold, the condition must be corrected before releasing it to a customer.

Release Schedule:

- Vehicle list will be posted on the Trucks Dealer Portal March 26, 2021.
- Owner notification letters will be released on or before April 23, 2021.
